6. All exhibits must be removed from the grounds between 6 & 8pm on Sunday July 14. Any items left become property of the fair grounds and will be disposed of and prize money will be donated back to the fair.
7. All exhibits will be judge, ribbons and cash prizes will be awarded, Judges decision is final.
8. All entries must have been canned or completed after July 25, 2023.
9. Jr. Division is for 16 years or younger, please list age on entry form.

Lemon Pound Cake Muffins

Ingredients:

- ½ Cup butter, softened
- 1 Cup Sugar
- 2 Large eggs, room Temperature
- ½ cup sour cream
- 1 Teaspoon vanilla extract
- ½ Teaspoon lemon extract
- 1 ¾ cups Kings Arthur Flour
- ½ Teaspoon salt
- ¼ Teaspoon baking soda



Directions:

1. In a large bowl, cream the butter and sugar until light and fluffy, 5-7 minutes. Add eggs, 1 at a time, beating well after each addition. Beat in the sour cream and extracts. Combine the flour, salt and baking soda: add to creamed mixture just until moistened.
2. Fill 12 greased muffin cups three-fourths full. Bake at 400* until toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean. 18-20 minutes. Cool for 5 minutes before removing from pan to a wire rack.

Glaze:

- 2 cups confectioners' sugar
- 3 Tablespoons Lemon juice

1. Combine the glaze ingredients: drizzle over muffins.

Put 5 muffins on a white disposable plate and put in a 2-gallon zip lock bag.

Hazelnut Pear Cake (con't)

Browned butter Glaze:

- ½ cup butter, cubed
- 3 tablespoons 2% milk
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1 ¾ to 2 cups confectioners' sugar

In a small heavy saucepan, melt butter over medium heat. Heat 5-7 minutes or until golden brown, sitting constantly. Transfer to a bowl. Stir in milk, vanilla and enough confectioners' sugar to reach desired consistency. Drizzle over cooled cake.

KINGS ARTHUR FLOUR BAKING CONTEST ADULT

Hazelnut Pear Cake

Ingredients:

- 1 ½ cups whole hazelnuts, toasted and skins removed.
- 1 cup unsalted butter, softened.
- 2 cups of sugar
- 4 large eggs, room temperature
- 2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- 1 teaspoon almond extract
- 2 ½ cups of Kings Artur Flour
- ½ teaspoon salt
- ½ teaspoon baking soda
- 1 Cup ricotta cheese
- 3 ripe medium pears peeled and chopped.



Directions:

1. Preheat oven to 350*. Grease and flour a 10 in. fluted tube pan. Chop 1 cup hazelnuts place remaining hazelnuts in a food processor: pulse until finely ground.
2. In a large brown, cream butter and sugar until light and fluffy, 5-7 minutes. Add eggs, 1 at a time, beating well after each addition. Beat in extracts.
3. In another bowl, whisk flour, salt, baking soda and ground hazelnuts; add to creamed mixture alternately with ricotta cheese. Beating after each addition just until combined. Fold in pears and chopped hazelnuts.
4. Transfer batter to prepared pan. Bank 55-65 minutes or until a toothpick inserted in center comes out clean. Cool in pan 10 minutes before removing to a wire rack to cool completely.
